Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a resident of suburban Cook County.
- Household income must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).
- Provide proof of identity, such as a valid government-issued photo ID.
- Available to participants ages 16-24.

The application period is March 24 – April 11, 2025. Participants accepted into the program will be placed in a paid summer job, gaining real-world experience, developing professional skills, and exploring career interests. The program runs June 9 – August 1, 2025, with participants working 28 hours per week and attending biweekly virtual professional development sessions on mental health, college & career planning, and civic engagement. This 8-week program helps youth build skills, gain confidence, and earn a paycheck.
